## **PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE**

### **Diversity in Our Options Helps Strengthen Our Cause**

Republican women are a powerful force in politics today as we increasingly take on leadership roles in the party, making voices heard on key issues like healthcare, family values to foreign policy. Actions Overview (2)

02/02/2023 Passed/agreed to in the House of Representatives. On agreeing to the resolution. Agreed by the Yeas and Nays:

328-86, 14 Present

After being considered and debated upon the resolution was referred to the House Committee on Financial Services. This resolution provides for consideration of the current resolution, H. Con. Res. 90, denouncing the horrors of socialism and providing for consideration of the resolution H. Res. 76, removing a certain member from a certain standing committee of the House. Motion to reconsider laid on the table and agreed to without objection.

A definite win for the home team and democracy! Justice was served! And we need to see more of this from our government.

H.R. 139 – The Show Up and Work Act of 2023

Sponsor: Rep. Comer, James [R-KY-1]

Introduced 01/09/2023

This bill requires each executive agency to reinstate the telework policies that were in place on December 31, 2019. Agencies may not implement expanded telework policies unless the Office of Personnel Management certifies that such policies, among other requirements, will have a positive effect on the agency's mission and operational costs.
